## *From Our Pastor*

### **PRAY FIRST!**

An old airline pilot tells a story of “The Last Best Hope.” He says that one day he was facing the imminent crash of his plane. After all the desperate “maydays” had been broadcast and attempts to fix the situation had been made, no solution was found. Death seemed certain. After the flight attendants had given their crash instructions to the passengers, the pilot made this announcement, “All of our efforts for recovery have failed. It is my duty, according to the rules of the air, to inform you that now we must enlist ‘The Last Best Hope.’ Pray to God. May He have mercy on us all!” The plane didn’t survive the “belly landing,” but every passenger did, as well as the crew members who tell about the power of prayer.

Isn’t it human nature to try everything ourselves first, and if that doesn’t work we might consider praying about it? God is sovereign, He is in control – seems like a prudent thing to do, to seek His highest will and purpose for our lives – through prayer.

Prayer is our lifeline to God. It’s a two-way conversation. Listening on our part is a treasure we often leave out. God still speaks, and we should listen!

Prayer is also communal, as we intercede for others in the Body of Christ and outside the church, i.e., for our governmental leaders, for first responders, for those serving in the military, for school teachers – the list goes on. We need Prayer Warriors who will “fill in the gap” for those who can’t pray for themselves. One definition I like about prayer is: *Prayer is the blood of Christ circulating among His people.*

Prayer breaks up calcified hardened hearts. It changes lives. God performs miracles through prayer. As scripture says, “The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.” James 5:16b

Could prayer be more important to Immanuel than this year? Just think what’s going on here: calling a new pastor; launching out with major renovations to the social hall and the sanctuary; reaching out to the lost and hurting in our community and world.

I learned a lot about prayer by joining Pastor Bjorn Pedersen of Prayer Watch International. We went to Eastern Africa to minister to pastors and wives in retreat settings. Bjorn always began his talks with

Do you best you can! That's my advice to you. I mean you can't do better than you can, can you? But you can do less than your best.

I really believe that God is okay with you doing the best you can. I haven't read anywhere that he demands perfection. As if that was possible. He knows we aren't perfect. Let me rephrase that, he knows I'm not perfect. I know it too! If he thought we could be perfect there wouldn't have been a reason for Jesus. He knows I'm going to screw things up. I know my kids are going to screw things up from time to time. But here's the thing, I love them as if they are perfect. And here's another thing, God loves me as if I was perfect. He loves me like I am perfect. Because of Jesus I am perfect in his eyes. My kids can't do anything to make me love them less. I can't do anything to make God love me more. He loves me perfectly. I can't do anything to make him love me less.

So back to the beginning. If God loves me perfectly - because I profess Jesus as my Savior and I'm baptized - why try to do the best I can? Why not do the best I can when I feel like it? Why do anything at all?

In my mind it's not a God thing it's an us thing. It's a worship thing. I don't think worship is only something you do most Sunday's when there is nothing else on the schedule. Worship is a 24/7 thing. Read Revelations. John is telling us what he is being shown in heaven. What he says is that in heaven there is no day or night, no days of the week. He says there is unending worship of the One seated on the throne. "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty." Sounds kind of boring and monotonous but I don't think it will be. All the cares and worries and pain and suffering and anxiety of this world will be gone.

Until then we do the best we can by intentionally thinking how we can achieve that worship here. Here are some but not all of my suggestions. Be nice, kind, and forgiving. If you see someone in need help them. If you see a sad face, give them some time and a hug. Volunteer at the Rescue Mission, food bank, FCA, Breaking Grounds, Beauty from Ashes. Help at a funeral luncheon or Fellowship club. Get up and bring your kids to Sunday school. Go to Sunday school yourself. Come to Thursday morning men's breakfast. Attend a women's event, help plan a women's event. Come to and help out at Ummata. Offer to serve on church council. Bring cookies for after church. Work a shift or two or three at the fair. Visit a shut in. Care Bears. Talk to someone you don't know after church. Talk to a young person. Talk to an older person. These are just some of the things we can do to move closer to "the best we can". Get out of the boat. Push your comfort zone.

Do the best you can because God has already done the best he can for you - Jesus!

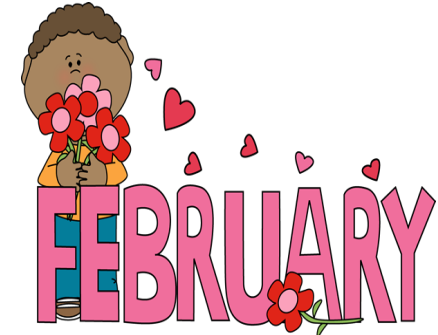
