Holy Communion is celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month as well as other special occasions of the church year. If you are baptized and have received instruction concerning the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to receive this sacrament here. If you would like to learn about either baptism or communion, please speak with the pastor before the service or check the box on the worship registration form to schedule an appointment. Only non-alcoholic wine is used in communion at Immanuel.

Moms and Dads, we love children and we welcome children to worship with you and the whole congregation. If you so desire, we do have a nursery – the room with the large window next to the Library at the back of the sanctuary. In there is a rocking chair, toys, as well as a speaker and large window so you can see and hear the service. Your kids may enjoy the activity bags on the rack at the back of the church.

Prelude

Welcome and Opening Prayer

Pastor: Gracious Lord, lead us by the Spirit into Your holy presence. Help us to leave behind our own ways and take up our crosses and follow You wholeheartedly. We want to worship You in Spirit and in truth and we invite You into this time of worship with us now. In Christ's holy name we pray. Amen.

Time of Confession and Forgiveness

Pastor: In Hebrews 4:14-16, we read: "Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."

Let us enter a time of silent reflection, recognizing those times in our life where we have chosen our own way over God's way, those times when we have fallen short.

*A moment of silent reflection,
recognizing our sin and seeking God's forgiveness.*

Pastor: Hear the good news from 1 John 1:9, "If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

We know that the mercy of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting. I declare to you, in the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven. May the God of mercy, who forgives you all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

The First Reading

Romans 10:5-15

⁵ For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law, that the person who does the commandments shall live by them. ⁶ But the righteousness based on faith says, “Do not say in your heart, ‘Who will ascend into heaven?’” (that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷ “or ‘Who will descend into the abyss?’” (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). ⁸ But what does it say? “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart” (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); ⁹ because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, “Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame.” ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. ¹³ For “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

¹⁴ How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? ¹⁵ And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!”

The Gospel Lesson

Matthew 14:22-33

²² Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³ And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴ but the boat by this time was a long way from the land, beaten by the waves, for the wind was against them. ²⁵ And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. ²⁶ But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, “It is a ghost!” and they cried out in fear. ²⁷ But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, “Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid.”

²⁸ And Peter answered him, “Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.” ²⁹ He said, “Come.” So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. ³⁰ But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, “Lord, save me.” ³¹ Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, “O you of little faith, why did you doubt?” ³² And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³ And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, “Truly you are the Son of God.”

The Children's Sermon

Sermon **“In the Midst of the Wind and the Waves”** Pastor Dawn Spies

Greetings and welcome to this time of worship and study. What a blessing to be together, here at Immanuel, online, and in every place where our people are. We miss being together! And we are grateful that God continues to grow our faith and comfort our hearts each day.

As we join the disciples today, we find Jesus pushing his disciples into a boat. The disciples had just watched Jesus feed 5000 men, plus women and children! They stood, astonished at the power and abundance of God. Jesus then loads the disciples into a boat, sending them off ahead, while Jesus dismisses the crowd. This crowd, the impromptu feast, had descended on Jesus while he was attempting to get away. We see, in Matthew 14:13, that Jesus “withdrew from there in a boat to a desolate place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns.” Now that the feast is over, he’s sent the crowd away, packed the disciples off in the boat, and finally, he “went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone” (Matthew 14:23).

As Jesus spent time alone, in prayer and devotion, in the presence of God, his father... the disciples were far from shore, being tossed around in the midst of the sea. What would it have been like to be the disciples? They had just watched their teacher multiply loaves and fish and feed a throng of people. Now, they hold on for dear life. They’re so worried and stressed out, when they see Jesus walking toward them, they assume he’s a ghost!

I have to admit, my first inclination is to look at the disciples and say, Jesus just feed thousands in your presence! You’ve seen him heal and teach and speak with authority! Why would you be worried! -- It would be easy to question their faith, especially as someone who’s NOT in the boat with them.

But, when I’ve been in the midst of difficult situations, when the world around me changes quickly, or I have too many decisions to make I often forget the abundance and provision of God too. I cling to worry and wonder what to do rather than clinging to Christ. What about you?

Now, notice how Jesus responds to their fear. He speaks to them calmly, in the midst of the wind and the waves saying, “Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid” (Matthew 14:27). He speaks with grace, even encouraging Peter when he wants to walk out, on the water, with Jesus!

God is the same today. Even, in the midst of our windy days, when we might forget, for a moment... God speaks to us with grace, saying, “Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid” (Matthew 14:27). Each day, if your own personal day is a bit windy, if the waves are crashing around, and on days when the weather is beautiful and the seas are calm, let us cling first and always to Jesus, the one who greets us with grace, joy and peace. Amen.

Confession of Faith

Pastor: The confession of faith provides a summary of our beliefs. Today, we hear Paul’s words from Romans 8.

We are convinced that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, and we have experienced that in everything God works good for those who love him and are called according to his purpose.

We are also sure that neither death nor life, angels nor demons, neither the present nor things to come, nor any powers, nor heights nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.

Pastor: In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Take the wafer from your communion set.

Take and eat, this is the body of Christ broken for you.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Take the wine from your communion set.

Take and drink, this is the blood of Christ given and shed for you.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

The Lord's Prayer

Pastor: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Your name, Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For Yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Post Communion Blessing

Pastor: The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace. Amen.

Benediction

Pastor: "The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you. The Lord look upon you with favor and give you peace" (Numbers 6:24-26). In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.
