

Only non-alcoholic wine is used in communion at Immanuel.

The venue opens at 5:00pm with food trucks. Bring your own chairs or take advantage of park bench seating. The City Band attracts participating musicians and audiences from all over the central San Joaquin Valley. It was established in 1887 and is recognized as one of the nation's oldest community bands. Join the folks for an evening of fun and relaxation. It's an outdoor event and the usually cool and comfortable. You may need mosquito repellant and most of all bring some water to keep hydrated.

All meals are provided and will be at the approximate cost of \$125.00 per person for the week, or prorated per participation time. ## Immanuel you are invited to the Literary Event of the season!


